If your answer is "Yes", write "a" in the box for Question 21

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- How does 'eternal life' come to believers in Christ?
  - Does it come as a *gift* the moment you believe (even if you *don't deserve* it),
  - or does it come to you later after you've shown *you deserve it*? (What you're given now is the *promise* of eternal life: you'll get it later if you show you *deserve* it.)
  - I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
- Even IF you already have eternal life *now*, what would happen if you sinned (and it was not by accident: you meant to do it; you knew it was sin)?
  - Would you *keep* your eternal life, even while you'd not yet repented of that sin,
  - or would you *lose* your eternal life and get it back again when you repented?
  - I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
- A true believer belongs to God's special family as his child. Now what happens if he sins, and he should know it's sin but he excuses himself instead of repenting?
  - God lets him stay in his family.
  - He puts him out till he repents.
  - I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
- Peter had been eating with Gentile believers because he *KNEW* you don't have to be circumcised to be God's child, but he stops eating with them (as if they were not God's children!) when he sees Jews arrive. Paul, in Galatians 2, calls it hypocrisy. Peter knowingly sinned! If he had died before repenting of this sin, would he have gone to heaven?
  - Yes
  - No.
  - I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
- Marko is a true believer. Usually he does not drink alcohol, but when his wife is unfaithful to him, he despairs and drinks hard to lose his sorrows. Then, totally drunk, he walks in front of a bus and dies drunk. Will he go heaven?
  - Yes
  - No.
  - I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
- Are you sure you will go to heaven?
  - Yes
  - No, I hope I will go to heaven, but I am not sure where I will go.

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7. Who is it you trust with the work of saving you from hell?
- I trust **myself alone** with that work – without the Lord's help.”
  - I trust **Jesus alone** with that work, without *any* help from me? (There's other work I do for God, but not *that* work. I've left that work to Jesus on the cross. It's all his job.)
  - I trust **the Lord and me**, both, working together. (My part is to try hard to obey God by his power; Jesus' part was to die for me to make up for where I fail.)”
  - don't know (or I cannot choose between a, b and c).
8. The Jews and the Romans put Jesus on the cross, but who was really *punishing* Jesus?
- It was *God* who punished Jesus, because of my sin.
  - No, God did not punish Jesus; *we* did. It was *me* (my sin) that punished Jesus.
  - I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
9. Are you someone who likes to say, “I am saved”?
- Yes.
  - No.
10. Daudi was a true believer. His brothers and their wives got AIDS and died, leaving his old mother to care for 12 kids! She begged him to take just *one* baby, but he refused: “We don't have enough money to feed even one more.” That same night his wife said, “People are saying you're not a man because we have only two kids: could we try to have one more?”, and he gladly agreed! Was he sinning?
- Yes.
  - No.
  - I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
11. When his wife said she wanted another baby, he was so happy he jumped up, but he hit his head on a beam and died. Do you think he would have gone to heaven?
- Yes.

12. Which *one* of these five women thinks like you do?
- Dorcas: “If I insult someone, I'll remain saved.”
  - Flora: “If I insult someone, I'll lose my salvation and need to be saved again.”
  - Sara: “If I insult someone, I lose my salvation and cannot be saved again.”
  - Teresa: “I'm truly saved. It's just not possible for me to insult someone.”
  - Anna: “I'm not saved.”
  - I don't know (or I don't think any of them thinks the way I do).
13. Stefano, the church treasurer, was a *true believer*. But he stole money from the church to pay a debt. When the pastor questioned him, he could not face the shame, so he lied and said he had not done it. The church put him out of fellowship. Then he suddenly died, *before* he'd confessed and been restored to fellowship. Do you think he went to heaven?
- Yes.
  - No.
  - I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
14. These days if you sin,
- do you never mean to do it,
  - or could it sometimes happen because you choose to do it (like Stefano)?
  - I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).

15. If you trust Jesus to be your Saviour, which sins in your life are *already covered and paid for* by Jesus' sacrifice on the cross? Which sins has God already punished?
- (a) Your PAST sins ONLY – at least, the sins you've repented of?
  - (b) Your PAST sins AND your FUTURE sins (Sins you haven't done yet or repented of yet, even sins you will do next year, they're already paid for *in advance* and God won't count them against you when you do them)?
  - (c) I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
16. If, on the day you die, you are a believer and you love God *very much* but not with *all* your heart (because your heart is not fully cleaned of sin yet), will you go to heaven?
- (a) Yes
  - (b) No
  - (c) I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
17. Two preachers are discussing "Grace": which one do you do you agree with?
- John:* "By grace, God has just GIVEN me eternal life, even though my life is so bad I still deserve to go to hell."
- Joseph:* "By grace, God ENABLES me to live a holy life so that I might deserve to have eternal life."
- (a) John?
  - (b) Joseph?
  - (c) I don't know which one I agree with (or I don't agree with either of them).
18. Elia is an evangelist who loves to give his testimony of the wonderful change in his life, but secretly for many years he has been sleeping with different women, drinking heavily, and practising witchcraft. He is full of hatred and never forgives anyone. But he dies when he is digging a well for poor people and the soil falls on him. Do you think he will go to heaven?
- (a) Yes
  - (b) No.
  - (c) I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
19. Titus is an evangelist who tries to preach the gospel to at least thirty people each day, *so that* when he dies the Lord will find him good enough and so accept him into heaven. He, too, dies while digging a well for poor people. Do you think he will go to heaven?
- (a) Yes
  - (b) No
  - (c) I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).

But he humbly trusts that it might help persuade God to accept him when he dies. He dies when he is digging a well for poor people and the soil falls on him. Will he go to heaven?

21. Abdullah is a devout Muslim who respects Jesus as a prophet, but not as God. He does not accept that Jesus died on the cross to save him from hell, BUT he tries to worship 'Allah' with all his heart. While he is digging a well for poor people in a village, the soil falls on top of him, and he dies. Will he go to heaven?  
 (a) Yes  
 (b) No.  
 (c) I don't know (or I cannot choose between a and b).
22. If someone does such an evil thing as to kill himself, we have to ask if he really was a believer, but Dani *was* a true believer. His wife was unfaithful to him, caught the AIDS virus and infected him. Then she left him, spreading lies about him at church and bringing SHAME on his name in the town: she said he was a witch, and his children believed her. Even his own parents believed her! He got very sick, failed his exams, lost his job and couldn't pay back his debt. Because people thought he was a witch, they burned his house and crops. When all this happened, Dani despaired. Although he was still A BELIEVER, he forgot how much God loved him, he took a gun, shot himself in the head, and died instantly. Did he go to heaven?
